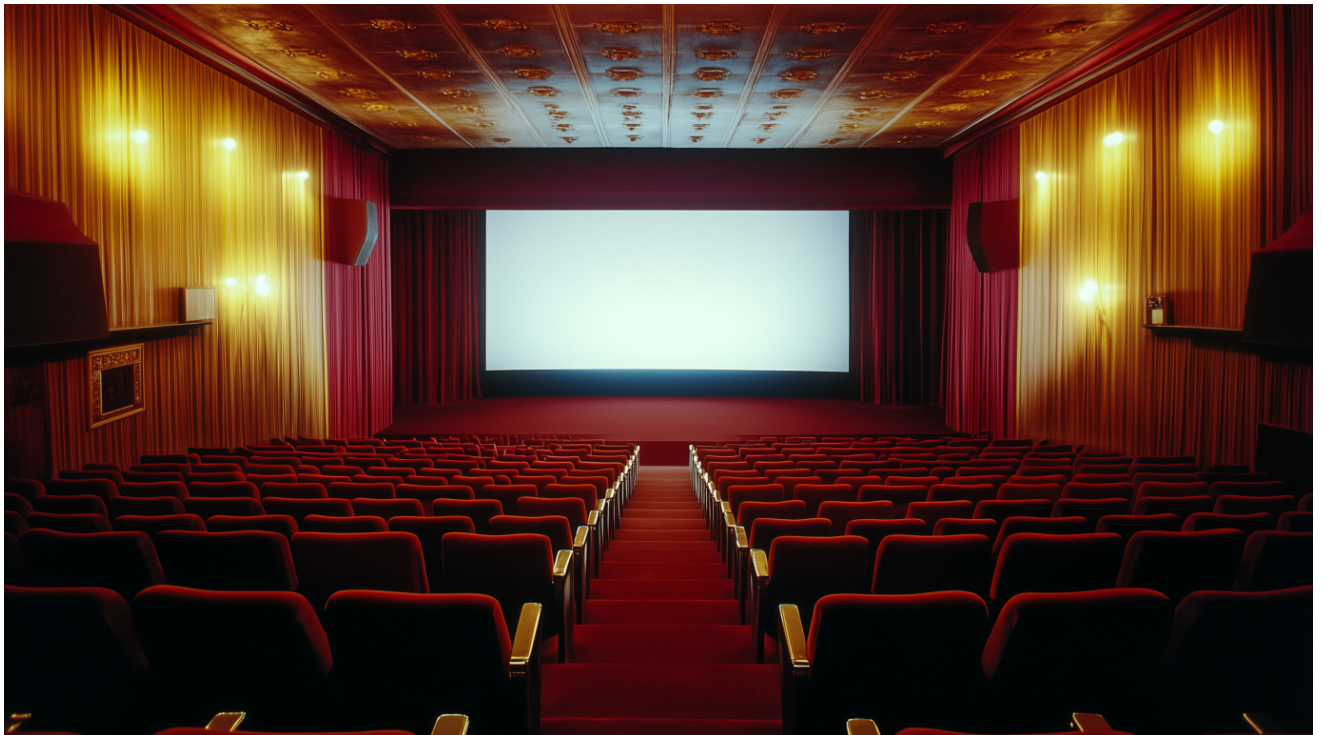




STAFF PICKS: Favorite movie soundtrack
